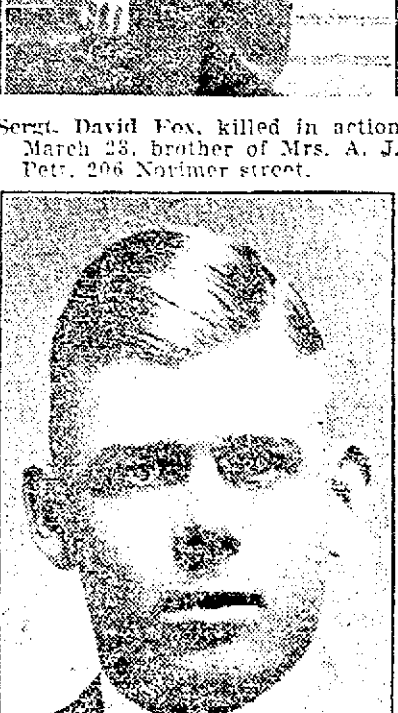

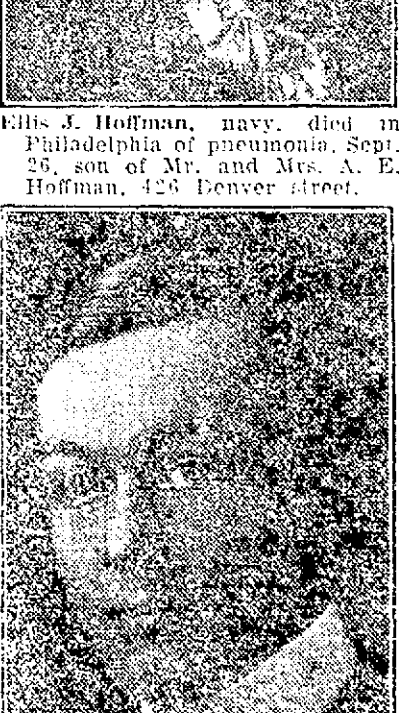

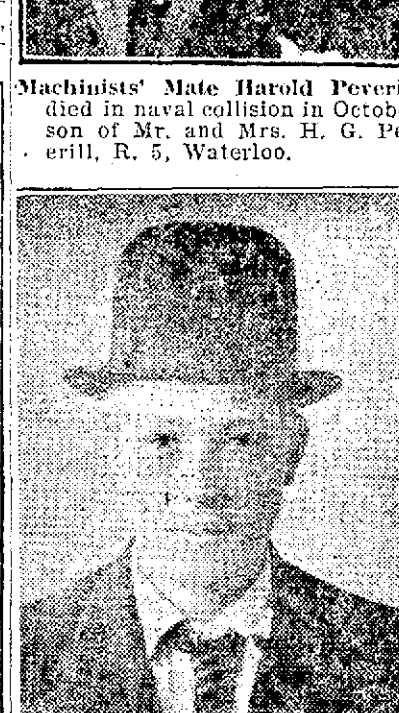

Pvt. John W. J. Farris, died of disease at Camp Pike, in August, son of Mrs. Prudy Farris, 921 Parker street.



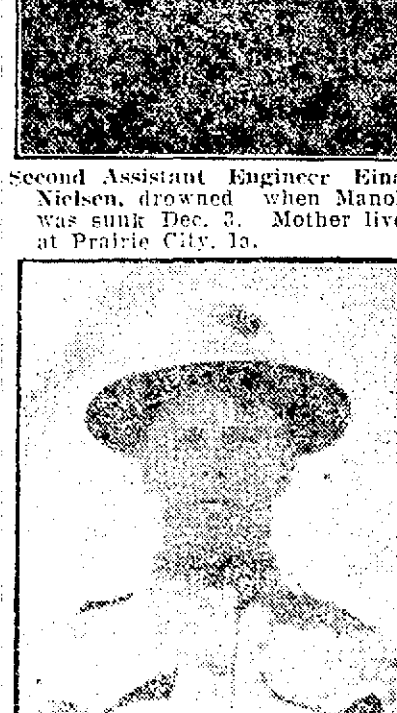
Second Assistant Engineer Einar Nielsen, drowned when Manola was sunk Dec. 3. Mother lives at Prairie City, Ia.



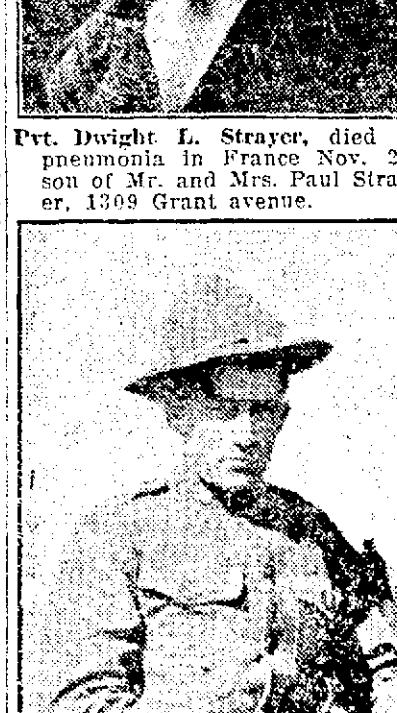
