The Lincoln Township Cemetery is located in Section 21 in the Northwest ¼ corner, almost in the center of Lincoln Township. It is located on Jackson Rd near 750 Street, 4 1/2 miles South of Anita on Hwy 148, then just West on Jackson Road. The coordinates are 41.374°N -94.767°W. The place is on a high hill and has an excellent view, especially to the South.

The cemetery of three acres was deeded from M. V. Robinson and his wife to John Gilbaugh, treasurer of the Lincoln Center Cemetery Association, on February 2, 1878 for \$40 per acre, on time until September 1877. The committee appointed was Frank Baumgardner. M. V. Robinson. S. S. King, S.H. White and John Gilbaugh with Mr. White as president. The Lincoln Center Cemetery " Articles of Incorporation" (1878) state that "The Association shall endure throughout all time". The prices of lots were:\$10,\$12.50,\$8 and \$5. J. .F. Dwigans purchased lot No.1. Mr. Dwigans hauled the material for the fence and this hauling charge, plus the cost of the fence material (\$8) which Mr. Dwigans had paid for, was allowed against the price of the lot. In April of 1898 it was "moved, seconded, and carried that the clerk have a tie rack put up in front of the cemetery at the least possible expense to have 30 posts set with good and sufficient brace holes in the top of the posts, six No. 12 strung through them well twisted together. " In April of 1899, It was then moved by F. D. Joy and was seconded by J. F. Gissible that all those being in arrears on lots in cemetery be notified by the clerk to settle for the same or bodies would be removed and buried in Potter's Field. It was then moved and seconded that C.H. DeWald be appointed to oversee cemetery for the ensuing year and be allowed \$2 for overseeing of cemetery for the last year. This information was taken from the 1980 Cass County History. According to the 1884 history of Cass County, the first internment was Mrs. Biggs, wife of Abram Biggs in a plot west of the church and south of the road. However, by the 1930 WPA Survey no stone marker remained of the gravesite. It is listed at that time that both Abram and his two wives were buried at the Evergreen Cemetery in Anita. The 1980 Cass County History Book indicates the last burial here was in February 1936, when M. V. Robinson was buried. However, Caroline D. Cron appears to be the last known burial in 1957 in their family plot. It was stated approximately 75 persons had been buried in the cemetery. There were more than those 75, as there are 96 names with documenting photos of the graves stones in the records in 2012. There may have been more buried there without makers. It has been said that there was an unidentified girl in a red dress buried by a family passing through the county by wagon.

The information is as complete as it is able. Whether from the weather, neglect, or vandalism, several of the markers are broken or missing. As a result, some of the rows and markers are not exactly in the proper original order. Additionally, some markers today are barely readable and have been reconfirmed by cemetery and historical records. Even the 1930 WPA records, as well, as the 1985 cemetery walk were incomplete and inaccurate. The cemetery was last walked at the end of 2011 and the present records verified by Carolyn DeLay and Mary Hoegh.
