

May 1865; that his personal description is as follows: 38 years; 5 feet, 8 1/2 inches, complexion fair, brown hair, blue eyes....at Flat Rock, S. C. on or about the 21 February 1865 he was shot below the thyroid cartilage ball passing downwards and backwards through apex of right lung, passing out behind through the body of the scapula. The ball was cut out by Surgeon Bond. (Zion) was carried about 100 miles in ambulance, put on a boat at (Cape) Fear River-taken to Beaufort, N. C. At Beaufort (two unknown words) thence to Grant General Hospital, New York Harbor. Furloughed April 14, 1865. Mustered out on or about the 30th day 1865.

Allen, David B. (born in Ohio) of Indianola, 37/38; Aug. 3, 1861 assistant surgeon, 1st Iowa Cavalry Rgt. April 10 or 21, 1863 surgeon, 30th Iowa Infantry Rgt. Feb. 25, 1864 resigned.

Bohn, Hermann G. (born in Germany), April 22, 1862 1stlt., 5th Mo. Cavalry Rgt. Sept. 25, 1862 mo; March 11, 1863 capt., assistant quartermaster, volunteers; Dec. 8, 1865 mo.

Bond, John W. (born in Md.) of Keokuk, 38; Sept. 9, 1862 surgeon, 30th Iowa Infantry Rgt. March 20, 1863 resigned.

Bond, Thomas P., 40; April 1, 1862 assistant surgeon, 32nd Ohio Infantry Rgt. Jan. 18, 1863 surgeon; July 20, 1865 mo at Louisville, Ky.

Burgess, John (born in Md.) of Fairfield, 41; Nov. 1, 1862 chaplain, 30th Iowa Infantry Rgt. Jan. 29, 1863 resigned at Vicksburg, Miss.

Dewey, Lauren (born in N. Y.) of Mt. Pleasant, 55; Sept. 3, 1862 maj., 30th Iowa 30th Infantry Rgt. March 12, 1863 resigned.

Henry, George A. (born in Pa.) of Glenwood, July 1, 1861 1stsgt., Co. A, 4th Iowa Infantry Rgt. March 5, 1862 2ndlt. March 7, 1862 slightly wounded by a tree limb at Pea Ridge, Ark. April 18, 1863 capt. 1865 provost marshal, 1st Division, XV Corps, Army of the Tennessee; July 24, 1865 mo at Louisville, Ky.

Lewis, Charles G. (born in Ohio) of Libertyville, 29; Sept. 9, 1862 assistant surgeon, 30th Iowa Infantry Rgt. Jan. 20, 1863 resigned at Vicksburg, Miss.

Lockwood, John C. (born in Del.) of Louisa County, 51; Oct. 15, 1862 1stlt./quartermaster, 30th Iowa Infantry Rgt. June 5, 1865 mo at Washington, D. C.

McPherson, James B., Nov. 14, 1828 born at Clyde in Sandusky County, Ohio; June 30, 1853 graduated from West Point (first of 52 graduates) and appointed brevet 2ndlt., Corps of Engineers and assistant instructor of practical engineering at West Point, a compliment never before awarded to so young an officer; appointed assistant engineer on the defenses of New York harbor, and on the improvement of the navigation of the Hudson River; 2ndlt. January 1857, placed in charge of the construction of Ft. Delaware; in charge of the erection of fortifications on Alcatraz island, San Francisco, Calif. and also connected with the survey of the Pacific coast; December 1858 1stlt. 1861 ordered to take charge of the fortifications of Boston harbor; Aug. 6, 1861 capt. Nov. 12, 1861 ltcol. and aide de camp to MajGen. H. W. Halleck; Feb. 1, 1862 chief engineer on staff of BrigGen. U. S. Grant; Fts. Henry and Donelson, Tenn. Shiloh, Tenn. May 1, 1862 col., additional aide de camp; chief engineering charge of the approaches to Corinth, Miss. May 15, 1862 briggen., volunteers; June 4-Oct. 4, 1862 commanded the Engineer Brigade, Army of the Tennessee; June 1862 appointed superintendent of military railroads in the District of West Tennessee; luka, Miss. Corinth, Miss. Oct. 8, 1862 majgen., volunteers; Oct. 16-24, 1862 commanded the 2nd Division, Army of the Tennessee; Oct. 24-Nov. 2, 1862 commanded the 2nd Division, XIII Corps, Army of the

Tennessee; Nov. 1-Dec. 18, 1862 commanded the Right Wing, XIII Corps, Army of Tennessee; Dec. 18, 1862-March 26 or April 23, 1864 commanded the XVII Corps, Army of the Tennessee; Vicksburg, Miss. campaign; Aug. 1, 1863 briggen., U. S. Army; Canton, Miss. Meridan, Miss. campaign; March 26 to July 22, 1864 commanded the Army of the Tennessee; Atlanta, Ga. campaign; Resaca, Dallas, Allatoona, Kolb's Farm, Kennesaw Mountain; July 22, 1864 while superintending the advance of his skirmish line in the battle before Atlanta, he had ridden from left to right, and was returning when he was confronted by Confederate skirmishers and received a shot in the breast, causing almost instant death and buried in Clyde.

Osterhaus, Peter J., Jan. 4, 1823 born at Coblenz, Germany; graduated from a military school in Berlin, Germany and served in the infantry; 1849 immigrated to the United States settling in Belleville, Ill. then Lebanon, Ill and then St. Louis, Mo. merchant and bookkeeper; April 27, 1861 maj., 2nd Mo. Infantry Rgt. Dug Springs, Mo. Wilson's Creek, Mo. Aug. 27, 1861 mo; Dec. 19, 1861 col., 12th Mo. Infantry Rgt. Jan. 1-Feb. 1, 1862 commanded the 2nd Division, Army of Southwest Missouri; (January-April commanded the 2nd Brigade, Army of Southwest Missouri;) Feb. 1-June 1, 1862 commanded the 1st Brigade, 1st Division, Army of Southwest Missouri; Pea Ridge, Ark. May 1-Dec. 1, 1862 commanded the 3rd Division, Army of Southwest Missouri; June 9, 1862 briggen., volunteers; Dec. 1-31, 1862 commanded the 1st Brigade, 1st Division, District of Eastern Arkansas, Army of Southwest Missouri; Arkansas Post, Ark. Jan. 4-May 17, 1863 commanded the 9th Division, XIII Corps, Army of the Tennessee; Vicksburg, Miss. campaign; wounded at the Big Black River, Miss. May 20-July 28, 1863 commanded the 9th Division, XIII Corps, Army of the Tennessee; Sept. 1, 1863-Jan. 4, 1864 commanded the 1st Division, XV Corps, Army of the Tennessee; Chattanooga, Tenn. and Missionary Ridge, Tenn. Feb. 6-July 15, 1864 commanded the 1st Division, XV Corps, Army of the Tennessee; Atlanta, Ga. campaign; July 23, 1864 majgen., volunteers; Aug. 19-Sept. 23 or 24, 1864 commanded the 1st Division, XV Corps, Army of the Tennessee; Sept. 23, 1864-Jan. 8, 1865 commanded the XV Corps, Army of the Tennessee; March to the sea; Carolina campaign; Jan. 8-May 27, 1865 chief of staff, Military Division of West Mississippi; to Jan. 15, 1866 commanded the military district of Mississippi; Jan. 15, 1866 mo; 1866-1877 U. S. consul at Lyons, France; returned to New York City and engaged in manufacturing and exporting hardware; 1898-1900 deputy consul at Mannheim, Germany, where he also continued the business; March 17, 1905 by an act of Congress placed on the retired list as briggen., U. S. Army; Jan. 2, 1917 died at Duisburg, Germany and buried there.

Reiner, Edwin (born in Ohio) of Columbus City, 23; Sept. 8, 1862 1stlt./adjutant, 30th Iowa Infantry Rgt. June 10, 1863 resigned.

Rogers, Samuel C. (born in Mass.) of Crystal, 41; March 12, 1863 assistant surgeon, 30th Iowa Infantry Rgt. May 25, 1865 surgeon but not mustered; June 2, 1865 mo at Washington, D. C.

Stone, George A. of Mount Pleasant, Oct. 13, 1834 born at Schoharie, N. Y., banker; May 9 or 14, 1861 1stltlt., Co. F, 1st Iowa Infantry Rgt. Aug. 20, 1861 mustered out at St. Louis, Mo. Sept. 28, 1861 pvt., Co. H, 4th Iowa Cavalry Rgt. Nov. 2 or Dec. 26, 1861 maj., 4th Iowa Cavalry Rgt. Aug. 10 or Sept. 27, 1862 col., 25th Iowa Infantry Rgt. commanded the 2nd Brigade, 1st Division, XV Corps, Army of the Tennessee; commanded the 3rd Brigade, 1st Division, XV Corps, Army of the Tennessee; March 13, 1865 brevet briggen., volunteers; June 6, 1865 mustered out; May 26, 1901 died at Burlington, Iowa and buried in Forest Home Cemetery at Mount Pleasant, Iowa.

Thurston, Alfred H., born in Rhode Island and appointed from New York, Oct. 5, 1861 surgeon, volunteers; March 13, 1865 brevet ltcol., volunteers; July 27, 1865 mo; Aug. 2, 1865 died.
