A NEW PROJECT that several members are involved with is finding what are called WHITE BRONZE GRAVE MARKERS in the county cemeteries. This is a state wide project headed by Loren Horton. Darrell Kerby has been doing research in cemeteries for this project. He will correlate all that is found in the county and sent this information to Mr. Horton. Darrell has found many markers but would appreciate any help you can give him in locating these particular markers.

Another project we have underway is a booth at the Davis County Fair. The fair dates this year are July 20-24. We have rented a booth in the building under the grandstand. We hope to have it manned afternoons and evenings. Several people have volunteered, but we still need several more helpers. Pat Howk and Jean Smalley are coordinating this project. We have 77 paid members at this time, but we still hear that people do not know about our genealogical society which is to promote the study of genealogy, preserve records of the past generation, to assist one another in our constant search of personal genealogy, and to establish and maintain a genealogical library through membership, donations, contributions and exchange. So, we want to let them know that we're here and what we have to offer family researchers.

So far this year we have had several informative and entertaining programs. Program chairmen, Mary Ellen Redman and Pat Howk have come up with some good topics. Several members got needed information from the speaker on "How to Become a D.A.R. Member." Darrell Kerby gave an entertaining less on courthouse records - as he reconstructed the history of one family line. Jerry Greene gave a report on the book, "The Library," a new acquisition of our genealgy library. The book contains information on every state and most countries of the world. We hope to have more programs, so keep your eyes on the newspaper article for future topics.

At the April meeting we discussed what type of books the society wants to buy to give to the public library. Several suggestions were given to Jerry Greene. He will decide what will be the best for us to purchase.

NOTE ON YOUR CALENDAR -- IOWA GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY ANNUAL CONFERENCE, Oct. 7 & 8, Scheman Continuing Education Center, Ames, Iowa. Featuring V. Ben Bloxham on "Your Ancestors in England" and Norman Wright on "Your English Ancestor in America."

Assessors survey made in Davis County, IA in 1935--it is a listing on cards arranged alphabetically by individual township or town. The survey was made for the benefit of Pension Fund. It gives name, address, date and place of birth, father's name, mother's name and residence at the time of survey. Available in Treasurers Office, Courthouse, Bloomfield, IA 52537.

PASSPORTS: If your ancestor returned to the old country to visit, he needed a passport. The passport applications give the place of birth, the birth date and personal description. Write: Diplomatic Records Branch, National Archives, Room 5-E, Washington, DC 20408 for passports through 1905. Write to the Passport Office, Dept. of State, 1425 K Street, N.W., Washington, DC 20502 for for passports issued in 1906 and later. Be sure to give the applicant's name, residence, and the place and approximate date of the application. A charge is made for the search and copies of the records.

GRAVE MARKER PROJECT -- Recently an interesting program was given at the Tama Co. Tracers meeting by Loren Horton, State Historical Society of Iowa. Horton discussed grave markers a better name than tombstones, gravestones or monuments.

WHAT ARE WHITE BRONZE GRAVE MARKERS? They are the very old, metal, foursided ones whose panels are bolted together. They are likely to be found in the very old parts of graveyards. Will you aid in Mr. Horton's project? Visit a cemetery, find the white bronze markers (usually bluish gray from age) and write down the name of the cemetery, the surnames of the people whose names appear on the marker, the death dates and the name of the manufacturer. Eventually he plans to publish a book. In Davis County, Iowa, send this information to Darrell Kerby, Box 94, Bloomfield, Iowa. Mr. Horton wishes to get the names of as many white bronze grave markers as possible in the state of Iowa. Take a warm afternoon to visit some cemeteries with which you are familiar and help in this search. Copy all of the writing on the stone if possible, especially the manufacturer.

BIBLE RECORDS PROJECT -- Illinois State Genealogical Society, P.O. Box 157, Lincoln, IL 62656. The purpose of this project is to collect and preserve Family Bible Records. The long-range plan is for the publication of these records. We prefer records with birthdates prior to 1920; however, if the records contain later birthdates also, it will still be accepted. As of April 23, 71 forms for this project had been sent for. There is no fee and the project is open to members and non-members. Forms are available in our Genealogy Library room or from Pat Hawk, Box 94, Bloomfield, Iowa for those interested in sending in Bible Records with Illinois interest.

A government legacy from Great Britain still is use in Delaware today is the "hundred." Today the hundred is primarily a geographic term denoting location. Dating from King Edmund I (939-946) a hundred was a unit of English local government between a village and a shire, or county. It is thought that the term denoted a geographical area large enough to provide 100 men in times of war. At one time in Delaware there were hundred constables, hundred courts, hundred school districts, hundred tax collectors, and hundred tax assessors. Now there are only hundred polling places. However, according to a history professor at the U. of Delaware, "People have very strong ties to their hundreds. They all know in which hundred they live." There are 33 hundred dividing Delaware today.

World War I Selective Service Records are rarely used as an information source. Almost every male born between 1873 and 1900 was required to register. Twenty-four milliom registration cards exist with a wealth of information. To make use of this information, you must give complete name and address of the person, a street address of the person resided in a metropolitan area, and the person's birthdate. Send this information with \$5.00 to Archives Branch, Federal Records Center, 1557 St. Joseph Avenue, East Point, GA 30044.

WALES: R. R. Williams, editor of the "Gwreiddiau GEYNEDO Roots" noted that Wales has publications helpful to Americans seeking Welsh roots. These publications were printed in the U.S. in Welsh and contain elaborate obituary notices which are not confined to the well-known. Early obituaries are from New York, Pennsylvania, Wisconsin, and Ohio and the publications were produced by the Welsh Methodist, Baptist, and Congregational Churches in America in 1838. If you wish to have a member of the society search these volumes, send the person's name, year of death, a SASE, and 2 International reply coupons to R. R. MAIDEN NAMES

A problem that we often have with our research is finding maiden names. When we find the name in one source, we are eager to assume that this is the maiden name we have been searching for. But the one source may not always carry the correct information. It is best to search several sources in hopes of finding the name repeated.

This is a list of some of the places you might search for the missing name:

- 1. Death certificate.
- 2. Obituary -- she may be survived by a father, brother or unmarried sister.

3. Marriage certificate.

4. Children's birth certificates -- often give mother's maiden name.

5. Children's death certificates.

6. Divorce papers.

7. Certificate of Naturalization of husband.

- 8. Land records-finding the woman on an index of grantees has sometimes, when followed through, found the grantor to be her father.
- 9. County histories -- often gives biographies of a family, telling the wife's maiden name.
- 10. Widows military pension--where the woman may have received a widow's pension for her husband's service in the Revolutionary War, Civil War, or War of 1812.

11. A family history of the husband's line may give the woman's maiden name.

12. Census records for 1880, 1900 and 1910--For these years the relationship to the head of the family was given for each person living in the household. You may find a mother-in-law living in the household; thus, in a large percentage of instances--the woman's maiden name.

13. Printed Church records or marriage records.

- 14. Unpublished Church records--if you know the church the woman was married in and approximate year, often a church will be willing to undertake a search of their wedding records.
- 15. Wills-She may have left something to her brother or unmarried sister. Likewise, she may have been willed something by her father, mother, brother or unmarried sister.
- 16. Family Bible Records.
- 17. A query in a genealogical magazine or periodical.

Never assume the first maiden name you find is correct. Search all records that are available to you.

NOTE: Death certificates will only help if she died within the past 100 years. If more than 100 years, check all of her children's death records.

Another possible source of a wife's maiden name would be a newspaper item around the time of her 25th or 50th wedding anniversary. Sometimes the celebration account will give family history.
