ORDINANCE NO. 17
AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A CEMETERY COMMISSION

SECTION 1. A Cemetery Commission is hereby established to assume jurisdiction and management of Pioneer Cemeteries in Davis County, Iowa, pursuant to Section 231.325 of the Code of Iowa.

SECTION 2. The Commission shall consist of 15 persons, 1 from each township, residents of Davis County, Iowa; appointed by the Supervisors with the help of the planning committee as follows: five of the members shall be appointed for a term expiring July 1, 2007; five for a term expiring July 1, 2008; five for a term expiring July 1, 2009; their successors in all cases shall be appointed for a term of five years, and all appointments to fill vacancies shall be for the unexpired term.

SECTION 3. The Commission shall select a Chair Person, Vice Chair Person, Secretary, Treasurer and such other officers as the Commission shall deem necessary. The Commission will appoint an advisory committee of 3 persons in each township to establish a program of work for Pioneer Cemeteries.

SECTION 4. The Commission shall have authority to establish such rules and regulations governing its organization and procedure, as it shall deem necessary.

SECTION 5. The Commission shall have all powers and duties relating to Pioneer Cemeteries, which may otherwise be exercised by the Township Trustees under the Code of Iowa. The Commission shall not have the authority to certify a tax levy.

SECTION 6. The Commission shall submit a proposed budget including the amount of available funds and proposed expenditures to the Davis County Auditor no later than January 1st of each year.

SECTION 7. The Commission shall receive no compensation for their services as such, but may be reimbursed for necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

SECTION 8. Should any part of this ordinance be held invalid, the remaining part shall be servable and shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SECTION 9. All ordinances or parts of the ordinance conflicting with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 10. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force after its passage and publication as required by law.

Passed by the Davis County Board of Supervisors on the 14th day of June, 2004.

DAVIS COUNTY GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY
(Article written for 1976 Davis County History Book)

Through the efforts of Mrs. Dorothy Goldizen the first meeting of the Davis county Genealogical Society was held January 24, 1974. At this first meeting the organization set up its objectives as to create and pursue an interest in genealogy, to preserve and disseminate genealogy and historical data and to aid individual members in compiling family genealogies.

Officers for the first year were: Mrs. Dorothy Goldizen, President; Mrs. Elaine Bankson, Vice President; and Mr. Lowell N. Francis, Sec.-Treas.

Members for the 1974 year were: Archie Rupe, Betty Judd, Helen Ritter, Vera McMains, Phyllis Thomas, Dorothy Goldizen, Elaine Bankson, Lowell N. Francis, David Dixon, Lois Jones, Hunter Jones, Irene Laws, Dorothea Pear Evans, Mable Bish, Gladys Goode, Robert Laughridge, Harry Price, Geneva Price, Maurine Whitacre, Sue Spilman, Ina Thompson, Margaret Halstead, Enid Stober, Mrs. Ruth M. Wilson, Mrs. Marguerite Luke, Mrs. Karen Roesch, Mrs. K. A. Wildman, and Eugene Dodge.

At this first meeting it was decided to set the dues at \$1.00 and the meetings to be held the third Thursday of every month in the basement lounge of the Davis County Courthouse.

A major event during the 1974 year for the Genealogy Society was the microfilming of records in the Davis County Courthouse and other individual genealogical records. This microfilming was done by the Latter-Day Saints of Salt Lake City.

A copy was purchased by the Genealogical Society for the use of the public at a cost of approximately

\$300.00. This copy of the microfilm will be housed at the Bloomfield Public Library. The funds for this project were raised by the membership by three moneymaking projects. One was a Tin Can to be passed around at each meeting for donations from the membership. The second was a Food Basket, with the food being donated by the membership. The third moneymaking project was a quilt made by the members. These last two projects were on an auction or chance buying basis.

The nominating committee for the 1975 officers was made up of Archie Rupe; Lois Jones, Chairman; and Irene Laws. This committee selected Dorothy Goldizen, President; Ina Thompson, Vice President; and Sue Spilman, Secretary-Treasurer. The membership of the club then duly elected the above people.

The paid membership for 1975, from January to March was Mrs. K. A. Wildman, Archie Rupe, Marguerite Luke, Irene Laws, Doris Thomas, Alice Huffman, Phyllis Thomas, Dorothy Goldizen, Roscoe Goldizen, Vera McMains, Mrs. Lyle Horn, Bev Morgan, Hunter Jones, Mrs. Hunter Jones, Peggy Arnold, Ina Thompson, Sue Spilman, Harry Price, Geneva Price, Ruth Wilson and Dorothea Pearl Evans.

The main project for the Davis County Genealogical Society continued to be the purchase of the microfilm and making the room donated by the Public Library a Genealogy Research Room.

To summarize the purpose of the Davis County Genealogical Society would be to say it is a group of people brought together by the same common interest of knowing who their families

were, to satisfy a basic curiosity as to where we came from is held by all, old and young, as the range of age in our own organization proves.

A special thanks is also given at this time to Mrs. Marguerite Luke and Sue Spilman for donating their time and money to make it possible for this brief history of the Davis County Genealogical Society to be printed.

DAVIS COUNTY GENEALOGY SOCIETY – THE PAST 30 YEARS

The Davis County Genealogy Society has moved into the 21st Century, some of us have gone kicking and screaming others have embraced the changes. Research today is done differently then it was when I started doing family research 30 plus years ago. Who would have dreamed that you would be able to do research on line, making family connections in minutes instead of months or years? I'm little old fashioned; I still like those dusty volumes in libraries and going to courthouses to find records that have been untouched for a hundred years. I can say that I have been able to make family connections on the Internet faster than blinking an eye. How we struggled at first to find a system to organize those notebooks full of notes into a usable order, now a good genealogy program for your computer makes this an easy task.

The Davis County Genealogy Society has grown in many ways in these past 30 years. Membership has been over 100 at times with members from out of state higher than local members. From East to West or North

to South many families went through Iowa and Davis County on their journey to a better life. Many stayed and have descendants living here now. The history they have left keeps us looking for more.

After purchasing the microfilm of courthouse records the Society purchased a reader-printer. This was a big investment and the group worked hard at raising the funds. We have built a good collection of books, family histories, and microfilm for researchers to use. All of our holding are housed at the Bloomfield Public Library and gets a great deal of use by local researchers and visiting researchers. Through the years the Society has reprinted and sold each of the three county history books. At the present time we are selling reprints of the 1882 Davis County History and hope to later this year reprint the 1924 Dillon Payne Davis County history.

Of the original membership four people are still active in the organization. We have had many wonderful people as members through the years but have lost them by death or for health reasons. Many of us will remember the hours that people like Olen McMains, Victor Fitzgerald, Peggy and Verle Arnold, Helen Walker, Irene Laws, Archie Rupe, Jerry Greene, Marguerite Luke and Darrell Kerby gave so that the rest of us could research.

A unique item that we have in our library collection is notebooks of old newspaper clippings. Newspapers were clipped for marriages, birth, deaths and other historical articles. These were arranged in binders, indexed and put out for the public to view. The earliest one is in the 1890's and we have current years. What fun to set down and read these articles.
