WHEREAS

the lot numbered one, of Section twenty eight, and the North West quarter, of the North East quarter, of Section thirty four, in Township thirty two, North of Range twenty eight, West, in the District of Kansas subject to sale at Fort Des Moines, Iowa, containing fifty two acres, and fifty four hundredths of an acre,

according to the official plat of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tracts have been purchased by the said

United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DO GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said

and to his heirs, the said tract above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said

William Stacy

and to his heirs and assigns forever.
