William Orr, and Nathan Coffman, according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the North East quarter of the South West quarter, and the North West quarter of the South East quarter, and the South West quarter of the North East quarter of Section fourteen, in Township Ninety two North, of Range twenty eight West, in the District of Lands Subject to Sale at Fort Des Moines, Iowa, containing one hundred and twenty acres.

William Orr, and Nathan Coffman, and to their heirs and assigns forever.
