To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

**Whereas,** In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 103,539 for 40 acres, issued in favor of *Jason Rice a Corporal in Captains Wheeler, Whitman and Collins' Companies of New York Volunteers, War of 1812*

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the South East quarter of the North West <sup>fractional</sup> quarter of Section Thirty, in Township Ninety two North, of Range Twenty seven West, in the District of Lands subject to Sale at Fort Dodge, *South*, containing forty Acres

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: *which has been assigned to Charles H. Doolittle and Egbert Bagg*

**Now know Ye,** That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said *Charles H. Doolittle and Egbert Bagg*

the Tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said Tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Charles H. Doolittle and Egbert Bagg and to their*

heirs and assigns forever.

**In Testimony Whereof,** I, *James Buchanan* PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
