George B. Senter, and Elias S. Root according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the East half of the North West quarter, and the West half of the South West quarter of Section twenty two, in Township ninety one North, of Range twenty eight West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Fort Dodge Iowa, containing five hundred and Sixty acres.
