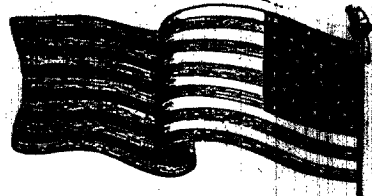

THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved March 3, 1855, entitled an "An Act in addition to certain Acts granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States," there has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, Warrant No. 10,063 for 80 acres, in favor of William Wood Private, Captain Price's Company Tennessee Militia War 1812

with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the West half of the South East quarter of Section Twelve in Township Ninety two North of Range Twenty seven West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Fort Dodge Iowa - containing Eighty acres

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, by the SURVEYOR GENERAL the said Warrant having been assigned by the said William Wood to James W. Huntz, in whose favor the said Tract has been located

NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said James W. Huntz, as assignee as aforesaid and to his heirs

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said James W. Huntz, as assignee as aforesaid and to his

heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, James Buchanan PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed

GIVEN under my hand, at the CITY OF WASHINGTON, the fiftieth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty three, and of the INDEPENDENCE OF THE UNITED STATES the eighty third
