To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved March 3, 1855, entitled "An Act in addition to certain Acts granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States," there has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, Warrant No. 21,785 for 80 acres, in favor of John Penney Private, Captain Smith's Company Virginia Militia War 1812

with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the West half of the South East quarter of Section Fourteen in Township Ninety one North of Range Seventy seven West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Fort Dodge Iowa, containing Eighty acres

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL the said Warrant having been assigned by the said John Penney to William R. Oliver and William L. Oliver, in whose favor the said Tract has been located

NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said William R. Oliver, and William L. Oliver, as assignees as aforesaid and to their heirs

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said William R. Oliver and William L. Oliver as assignees as aforesaid and to their

heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, James Buchanan PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
