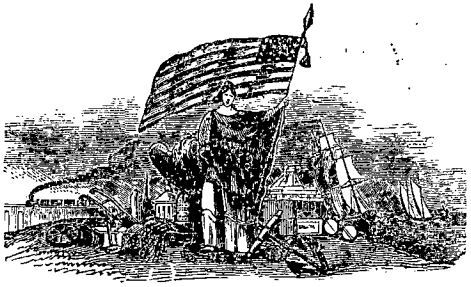

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved March 22d, 1852,

entitled "An Act to make Bounty Land Warrants assignable, and for other purposes," Warrant No. 8,528

for 40 acres, issued in favor of:

Hamlet Seranton, Private in Captain Hulburt's Company, New York Militia, Patriot War,

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the

South East quarter of the North East fractional quarter of Section Four, in Township ninety three North, of Range twenty-nine West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Fort Dodge, Iowa, containing Forty Acres,

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said

Leonard Low,

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Leonard Low and to his

heirs and assigns forever.
