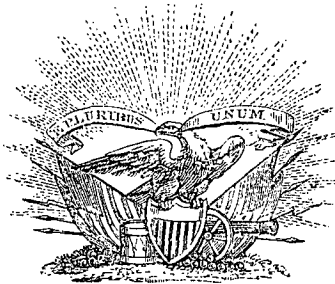


Office of H. C. Longnecker - showing that the title of his land remains in the name of the U.S. 56907. H. C. L.



THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 77,776 for 40 acres, issued in favor of *James Robbins, Private in Lieutenant Goodman's Company, Massachusetts Militia Nov of 1812.*

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the *South East quarter of the North East quarter of Section four, in Township ninety-two, North, of Range thirty West, in the District of Kansas subject to sale at Fort Dodge, Iowa, containing forty acres,*

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: *which has been assigned to Henry S Longnecker,*

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said

Henry S Longnecker,

the Tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said Tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Henry S Longnecker, and to his*

heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I, *James Buchanan* PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
