To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas Charles J Nourse Executor of the estate of Charles J Nourse Deceased of Washington City District of Columbia has deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States, a Certificate of the REGISTER OF THE LAND OFFICE at Fort Dodge whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Charles J Nourse Executor of the Estate of Charles J Nourse Deceased according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the South half of Section eight in Township ninety one North of Range twenty nine West in the District of Lands subject to sale at Fort Dodge Iowa containing three hundred and twenty acres

according to the official plat of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tract has been purchased by the said Charles J Nourse Executor of the estate of Charles J Nourse Deceased

NOW KNOW YE, That the

United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DO GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said

Charles J Nourse Executor of the estate of Charles J Nourse Deceased

and to his heirs, the said tract above described: To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Charles J Nourse Executor of the estate of Charles J Nourse Deceased and to his heirs and assigns forever.
