OLD PARTNERS FALL OUT

Suit for an Accounting — Roth's Claim of \$125,000 Against Bois. Special to The Journal.

Sioux City, Iowa, March 12.—A suit brought by G. W. Roth, an attorney of Sheldon, against W. D. Bois, his former partner and recently a candidate for the district judgship, to obtain an accounting of their receipts as a firm, has just been submitted to Judge Wakefield at Primghar. Roth claims one-third of the receipts of the firm for ten years up to 1901, which he says, leaves a balance due him of \$125,000.

Mr. Bois says the partnership was practically dissolved five years ago, also that since that time Roth performed services for his sister-in-law's estate to which, he says, he should have two-thirds if the court finds the partnership existed till 1901.
