

# CHARGES AGAINST JUSTICE DROPPED

Charge of passing worthless checks against George Regenber, Moline justice of the peace, were dismissed by Magistrate Frank Gustafson in the Moline police court today. Regenber settled up with people who claimed he gave them checks without having sufficient funds in the bank.

He was arrested early this week on a state warrant sworn to by Rose Seidler, who alleged that he gave her a worthless check. A number of other people brought in checks after his arrest. He paid the costs of the suit which amounted to \$3.

# SETTLEMENT MADE BY G. W. REGENBERG; CHARGE DISMISSED

The charge of embezzlement against George W. Regenber, Moline justice of the peace, was dismissed by Magistrate Frank Gustafson in the Moline police court this morning after it was announced that a settlement between the complainant and defendant had been made.

Regenber was arrested on Aug. 25 on a state warrant sworn to by Kathryn Leopold of Moline, who alleged that the justice had failed to turn over \$400 collected for her. The costs amounting to \$3 were paid by the justice.
