It is also unclear as to who Anistina Regenberg Lorenzen is. Anistina Regenberg is named in a suit brought by Herrman Regenberg, against his father's (Frederick Regenberg) estate. At this time, I have no idea if Anistina is the daughter of Frederick and his first wife, or the daughter of Frederick and Ernstina. The 1900 United States Federal Census states that Ernstina is the mother of 8 children - 7 living. Karl died at the age of 7 days old on Christmas Eve 1880 - leaving George, Emma, Anna, Mattie, Edith & Frank. If she is their daughter, that would explain the 7 living children, providing she is not claiming Otto as her child.
