FRITZ REGENBERG – and his family came from Wisconsin to this area in 1877, six years after the first settlers had come, and during the last year of the terrible grasshopper siege. By this time the railroad had been laid as far northwest as Sheldon. Regenbergs traveled on the train that far, and the rest of the journey had to be made by following trails or going through the fields of prairie grass. Their farm was located a short distance southeast of where George is now, across the road from where Ude and Brunt Uden lived a little later. Regenbergs had four girls and two boys. Mattie was one of the daughters and she married Ude Uden. The others left this area.
