We are indebted to U. A. Uden for a neat job of work he did on our press that was quite difficult. He cut a left handed double thread on a roller and a bar to the same, making a vibration of nearly three inches. If our people only knew it, there is many a difficult break that this man can repair and say delays and heave expense in relapsing the broken or worn parts with new ones.
