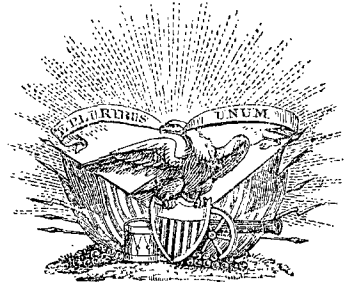

THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,



To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 85,738 for 40 acres, issued in favor of *George Day, Private in Captain Harlow's Company, Maine Militia, War 1812*

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the *South East quarter of the North East quarter of Section twenty four, in Township nineteen North, of Range thirty two, West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Fort Dodge, Iowa, containing Fifty Acres*

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: *which has been assigned to Isaac A. Pennock,*

Now know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said *Isaac A. Pennock*

the Tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said Tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Isaac A. Pennock and to his*

heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I, *James Buchanan* PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
