To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Know Ye, That in pursuance of the Act of Congress, entitled "An Act to raise for a limited time an additional military force, and for other purposes," approved February 11th, 1847.

*Ignaz Graf late a Private in Captain Kessler's Company, Ohio Volunteers:*

having deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE a WARRANT in *His* favor, numbered *79240*,

THERE IS THEREFORE GRANTED BY THE UNITED STATES, unto *Ira Cook* assignee of said *Ignaz Graf* and to his Heirs the South West quarter of Section twenty-two, in Township twenty-one North, of Range thirty-two, West, in the District of Kansas subject to sale at Fort Dodge, Kan, containing One hundred and sixty Acres

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tract has been located in satisfaction of the above mentioned Warrant, in pursuance of the Act of Congress above mentioned, approved February 11th, 1847. TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said *Part of said* section of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Ira Cook* and to his

heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I, *James Buchanan* PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
