WHEREAS, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved March 3, 1855, entitled "An Act in addition to certain Acts granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States," there has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, Warrant No. 58386 for 120 acres, in favor of

with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the east half of the south west quarter, and the south west quarter of the south west quarter, of section twenty, in township ninety two north of range thirty two west, in the District of Iowa, subject to sale at Fort Dodge, Iowa, containing one hundred and twenty acres,

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL. The said warrant having been assigned by the said Nathan Wilcox to Daniel Backer in whose favor said tract has been located

NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said Daniel Backer as assignee as aforesaid, and his heirs,

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Daniel Backer as assignee as aforesaid, and his

heirs and assigns forever.
