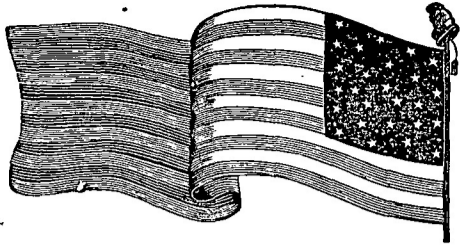

THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved March 3, 1855, entitled "An Act in addition to certain Acts granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States," there has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE,

Warrant No. 67526 for 160 acres, in favor of

Ann E. Armor, Widow of William Armor, private,

Captain Byers' Company Pennsylvania Militia, War 1812,

with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the North West quarter of Section Twenty Three, in Township Twenty Three North, of Range Thirty Three West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Fort Dodge Iowa, containing One Hundred and Sixty acres.

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL

has said warrant having been signed by the said Ann E. Armor to Ruth Armor in whose favor said tract has been located

NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said

Ruth Armor as assignee as aforesaid, and to her heirs

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Ruth Armor as assignee as aforesaid, and to her

heirs and assigns forever.

PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
