



Paris F. 1980 Baughman, 92

Kirkman - Paris Fisk Baughman, son of Clarence and Charlotte Caldwell Baughman was born June 22, 1888 on a farm in Fairview twp., in Shelby county. He attended Babbit Hollow country school, Shelby county and at the age of 13, began working on various farms in the area.

On Dec. 25, 1918 he married Lillian Adams at the Kirkman Methodist Parsonage. Four children were born to this union. After their marriage, they farmed near Kirkman for many years. After Mrs Baughman's death on Jan. 7, 1971, Mr Baughman continued to live on the farm and made his home with his son, Gene for a few years. On Dec. 27, 1977, he became a resident of the Baptist Memorial Home in Harlan.

He was a member of the Kirkman United Methodist church. He died at the Baptist Memorial Home on Saturday, Oct. 25, 1980, at the age of 92 years, 4 months and 3 days.

In addition to his wife and parents, he was preceded in death by two brothers, W. A. (Guy) and Sam and three sisters, Vernie, Iva and Maud. Survivors include one daughter, Cecile (Mrs George) Abell of Ellsworth, and three sons, William Clarence and Donald Gene of Kirkman and Franklin Dale of Harlan; 14 grandchildren, four step grandchildren, four great-grandchildren and four step great-grandchildren and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at Pauley Funeral Home on Tuesday, Oct. 28, 1980 with Rev. Leon V. Wallace of United Methodist church, Kirkman, officiating. Burial was in Rose Hill cemetery in Kirkman with Roger Abell, Jerry Abell, Gale Baughman, Lynn Baughman, Richard Williams and Russell Baughman serving as casketbearers.
