Howard S. Boardman, 75

Howard Stewart Boardman, son of John Wesley and Henrietta Stewart Boardman was born March 30, 1909, in Shelby co. Howard attended school in Tennant and graduated from Tennant high school. He later attended ISU and graduated in 1933.

On April 20, 1940, he married Lorraine Prescott at the Congregational church in Downer's Grove, Ill. On Sept. 25, 1943, he was commissioned into the U.S. Navy as a Lieutenant. He served his country during WW II in the Bureau of Ordanance, at the

Navy Dept. in Washington D.C.

After his Honorable Discharge on March 31, 1952, he returned to the Wisconsin Steel Company in Chicago, Ill., residing in Flossmoor, Ill. He continued to work at Wisconsin Steel Co. until he retired in 1973. Mr and Mrs Boardman then moved to Fla. in 1974. This has been their home since that time.

He was a member of the Association of Iron and Steel Engineers. He died at Lake Community Hospital in Leesburg, Fla., on Sunday, Sept. 23, 1984 at the age of 75

years, 5 months and 24 days.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by two brothers David and Eugene; and one sister Charolette Plumb.
