David Boardman, 72


John David Boardman, the son of John Wesley and Harrietta (Stewart) Boardman, was born July 1, 1911, on a farm near Tennant. He grew to adulthood on his parents farm and graduated from Tennant high school in 1929. He then attended the University of Nebraska for two years to study agriculture.
