Wife of Atlantic Man Is

Dead at Iowa City.

Mrs. Eva Book, wife of Ted Book, one of the proprietors of the Park barber shop, died at a hospital in Iowa City yesterday morning. She has been afflicted for some time with tuberculosis of the throat. A recent operation was had and for a time it was thought she was improving. Monday afternoon Mr. Book was called to Iowa City by a message saying his wife's condition was critical.

Mrs Book's maiden name was Sells. Her father is Roy Sells of Council Bluffs. She was born in Avoca and was 24 years of age. She graduated from the Logan schools. Mr. Sells is a traveling salesman. The family formerly lived at Avoca. It was there Mrs. Book grew to womanhood. She was married to Mr. Book some five years ago. They came to Atlantic four ago. They have a son, Junior, two years old. She is survived by her father and a sister, Mrs. Orson Babe, of Piagah, Iowa.—Atlantic News Telegraph.

The body was brought to Avoca and the funeral held at the Congregational church today at 2:30 p. m. where a large number of friends gathered to pay their last respects. All extend sympathy to the bereaved family.
