

# Olga M. Brehmer, 72

Harlan - Olga Magdalene Brehmer was born on a farm in Audubon county near Kimballton, daughter of Ole and Matilda Hansen Jensen, born on Febr. 22, 1908. She was baptized and confirmed at Bethany Lutheran church near Kimballton. She attended country school and graduated from Kimballton high school while growing to adulthood on her parent's farm.

Olga married Ralph Brehmer in Omaha, Nebr., Jan. 30, 1932. This union was blessed with one son. They farmed near Marne, Atlantic, Walnut and Anita until Ralph's death on March 19, 1953. Olga then moved into Atlantic and worked as a cook.

In the fall of 1956, she moved to Harlan and purchased the Hotel Coffee Shop, which she operated until 1974. After selling the restaurant, she continued to work there until last fall, when she retired to make her home with her brother Aurthur Jensen at 805 Walnut, Harlan. Olga died at her home on Sunday, Aug. 31, 1980 at age 72 years, 6 months and 9 days.

Her survivors include one son, Burdette of Atlantic; three grandchildren; two greatgrandchildren; four brothers - Arthur Jensen of Harlan, Harry Jensen of Kimballton, Folmer Jensen of Kimballton and Erny Jensen of Phoenix, Ariz; one sister, Mayme (Mrs. Eldon) Kay of Atlantic and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan, on Tuesday, Sept. 2, 1980, with Pastor David E. Cave, Minister of Congregational Church, officiating. Burial was in Atlantic cemetery, with Dick Bell, Charles Mayne, Lee Sunderland, Lowell V. Holmes, Ralph Van Cleave and Furman M. Miller serving as casketbearers.
