According to Harlan Police, the accident took place about - The driver, Scott 1:15 p.m. Authorities said the Campbell (Russell), 16, of car, driven by Campbell, was Harlan, who sustained multiple headed south on 10th Street at a leg fractures; high rate of speed. As the car
