Irwin — Clifford Lyle Campbell, son of Milton Marion and Martha Magnus Campbell was born Sept. 28, 1907 on a farm in Greenley twp., Shelby co. He graduated from the Greeley Center school and grew to adulthood helping on the family farm. He then farmed for himself for a few years.

On Feb. 22, 1939, he married Thelma Sleister at the Presbyterian Parsonage in Denison. Four daughters were born to this union. After their marriage, they continued to farm. They lived on his parents' farm for four years before moving to their own farm near Defiance in 1943. This has been their home since that time.

He was baptized at the United Methodist church in 1955 and has been a member there ever since. He died at Myrtle Memorial hospital in Harlan on Friday, Jan. 1, 1982 at the age of 74 years.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by an infant brother, Marion. He is survived by his wife, Thelma of Defiance; four daughters, Carolyn (Mrs Reuel) Andersen of Grand Island, Neb., Marlene (Mrs Kenneth) Johnson of Bellevue, Neb., Nancy (Mrs Dale) Brant and Jean (Mrs Rocky) Barnett, both of Harlan; nine grandchildren; two brothers, Clarence of Defiance and Lowell of Denison; nieces, nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan on Monday, Jan. 4, 1982 with Rev. Leon Wallace of the United Methodist Church in Irwin, officiating.

Burial was in the Harlan cemetery with Milton Barry, Dwayne Barry, Paul M. Nielsen, Albert Schwarte, Edward Schwieso and Harry Ahrenholtz serving as casketbearers.
