

Mrs Edith P. Campbell, 94

IRWIN — Edith Pearl Campbell, the daughter of Robert and Maggie (Walker) Woods, was born on a farm in Shelby County just west of Irwin on Aug. 25, 1885. She attended country school and grew to adulthood on her parent's farm.

On Feb. 22, 1905, she married James Arthur Campbell at the Congregational Church parsonage in Harlan. Five children were born to this union.

Mr and Mrs Campbell made their home on the Campbell family farm west of Irwin. After Mr Campbell's death in April, 1972, Edith continued to live on the farm until becoming a resident of the Baptist Memorial Home in Harlan in July of this year. It was here that she died on Oct. 10, 1979, having attained the age of 94 years, one month and 15 days.

In addition to her parents and her husband, she was preceded in death by a grandson, Donald Ralph Campbell; two brothers, William and Walter; and two sisters, Jennie and Mabel.

Her survivors include four sons - Maurice and Ralph Campbell, both of rural Irwin and Howard and Floyd Campbell, both of rural Defiance; a daughter, Arlene Campbell of rural Defiance; seven grandchildren; 28 great-grandchildren; three great-great-grandsons; a great-great-granddaughter; nieces and nephews; other relatives and friends.

Funeral services were held at the Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan, Friday, Oct. 12, 1979, with the Rev. Leon V. Wallace, pastor of the Irwin United Methodist Church, officiating.

Interment was in the Oak Hill Cemetery, Irwin, with Lyle Campbell, Larry Campbell, Marvin Campbell, Norman Campbell, Vernon Campbell and Robert Ahrenholtz serving as casketbearers.
