

THE LIFE STORY OF —

Campbell, 80**

Harlan — Ida Katherine Campbell, daughter of Claus and Katherine Stracke Leucke, was born on a farm in Lincoln twp., Shelby county, on June 18, 1897. She died at Myrtue Memorial hospital in Harlan on Jan. 6, 1978 at age 80 years, 6 months and 18 days. Ida attended country school and grew to adulthood on her parent's farm. On May 2, 1917, she married George Campbell at the Charles Booth residence in Harlan. Seven children were born to this union. From 1917 until 1961, Mr and Mrs Campbell farmed in Lincoln, Jackson and Polk twps. before making their home at 1710 7th St. in Harlan. She has been a long time member of the First United Methodist church in Harlan and also the United Methodist Women as well as the Get Together club.

Mrs Campbell was preceded in death by her parents; one son, Sheldon Campbell; two great-grandsons; a brother, Henry; and a sister, Mathilda. Survivors include her husband, George of Harlan; two daughters - Phyllis (Mrs Quentin Rickers) of Harlan and Delores (Mrs Gerald Rock) of Council Bluffs, four sons - Kenneth, Keith and Russell, all of Harlan and Victor of Mystic, Conn.; 20 grandchildren; ten great-grandchildren; nieces and nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan on Monday, Jan. 9, 1978 with Rev Larry LaVelle, pastor of the First United Methodist church in Harlan, officiating. Burial was in the Harlan cemetery, with Dan W. Rock, Kevin Campbell, Kenneth E. Campbell, Douglas R. Rickers, Darwin K. Campbell and Michael E. Campbell, all grandsons of Mrs Campbell, serving as casket-bearers.
