

THE LIFE STORY OF —

Vearl G. Chamberlain, 68

Vearl George Chamberlain, son of Emery and Ann Harriet Baxter Chamberlain was born June 7, 1914 on a farm near Panama. He was baptized, received his First Communion and confirmation at St. Mary's Catholic church in Panama and attended St. Mary's Catholic school. He grew to adulthood helping on the family farm and then continued to live and farm there.

On Feb. 16, 1943, Vearl married Mildred Blum at St. Mary's Catholic church in Panama. Ten children were born to this union. After their marriage, they made their home on his family's farm. This was their home for many years. After retiring three years ago, the Chamberlains continued to live on the farm. Mr Chamberlain was a life-long member of St. Mary's Catholic church in Panama. He died at Bishop Clarkson Memorial hospital in Omaha on Sept. 26, 1982 at the age of 68 years.

In addition to his parents, Vearl was preceded in death by one grandchild and one brother in infancy. He is survived by his wife Mildred of Panama; eight sons, Emery of Panama, Richard of Omaha, Donald of Harlan, Ted of Treynor, Russ, Jerry, Randy and John, all of Harlan; two daughters, Sharon (Mrs Jerry) Anderson of Pierce, Neb., and Mary Lou (Mrs Ron) Fees of Valentine, Neb. 25 grandchildren; one brother, Irvin Chamberlain of Panama and one sister, Berniece Klein of Omaha.

A concelebrated Mass of Christian burial was celebrated at St. Mary's Catholic

church in Panama on Wednesday, Sept. 29, 1982 with the Rev. David Fenelon as celebrant and the Rev. Robert J. Chamberlain, nephew, as concelebrant.

Burial was in St. Mary's cemetery with Ken Muell, Joe Michels, Ural Smith, Bob Schomer, Joe Sullivan and Kenneth Tremel serving as casketbearers.
