DEFIANCE — Andrew Martin Christensen, son of Nels Peters and Johanna Jensen Christensen, was born in Aalborg, Denmark on March 10, 1893. He died at Myrtue Memorial hospital in Harlan, on May 18, 1977, at age of 84 years, two months and eight days. He was baptized in the Lutheran church and grew to adulthood in Denmark. He came to the United States in 1910 and settled in the Harlan vicinity where he worked as a farm hand. In Dec. of 1917 he entered the Army and served his country in the A.E.F. in Siberia. After receiving his honorable discharge in Nov. of 1919, he returned to the Harlan area.

On Nov. 30, 1921, he married Esther Kemp in Atlantic. Three children were born to this union. After their marriage, Mr and Mrs Christensen farmed in Center twp. for five years. In 1926 they moved to Cass county where they farmed until 1936. They then moved to a farm in Lincoln twp. In 1940 they moved to a farm in Union twp. and this was their home until retiring in 1962. They then moved to Harlan and in April of this year they became residents of the Baptist Memorial Home. This has been his home since that time.
