GEORGE H. CLARK, 65

George H. Clark, 65 of St. James, Minn., formerly of Irwin, died of an apparent heart attack Monday, April, 1971, at his home. The son of Mr and Mrs Edward Clark, he was born at Irwin, on February 4, 1906. He graduated from the Irwin schools and was married at Emmetsburg on September 7, 1935. Mr Clark farmed southwest of St James. He was a member of the United Methodist church and was on the board of trustees of the church. He was also chairman of Watonwan County ASCS committee and treasurer of South Central Electric association, had been on the board of directors of ASCS since 1944 and had been on the board of directors of South Central Electric since 1955. Mr Clark bowled regularly with the Citizens State Bank team for 26 years.

Mr Clark is survived by his wife, the former Gladys Rinde and a sister, Mrs Peter Kjer of Chico, Calif. His parents preceded him in death.

Services were held at 2 p.m. Wednesday at the United Methodist church in St. James with burial at Mt. Hope cemetery. Rev Oley Wilson officiated with Jenses-Watonwan Funeral home in charge.
