HOMER CLARK, 82

IRWIN — Homer, son of Joseph and Ethel Shannon Clark, was born June 30, 1892, on a farm north of Irwin. He attended the rural schools near his home and later Irwin high school. He attended business school in Omaha and married Beulah Olson on March 3, 1923. Homer farmed near Irwin until retiring to Irwin about 12 years ago. Here he enjoyed the simple pleasures of home, especially being with his grandchildren. He died at his home on Friday eve. Aug. 30, 1974 at age 82 years and 2 months.

He was preceded in death by his parents and three sisters. Survivors include his wife, Beulah; two sons, Loren and Howard, both of Irwin, one daughter, Jean (Mrs Gerald Lanman) Co. Bluffs, seven grandchildren and one great grandchild, by one brother, Milo Clark, Botna and other relatives.

Homer was baptized in the Methodist faith and was a member of the United Methodist church of Irwin. He served his country overseas during WWI in the battles of Chatean-Thierry, Argonne Forest and St. Miachel. He was a member of Austin Hiatt Post No. 614, Irwin, of the American Legion.

Funeral services were held on Monday, Sept. 2, 1974 at the United Methodist church in Irwin. Rev. J. Elmer Brunk, officiated. Burial was in Oak Hill Cemetery in Irwin.
