Cleveland, was born Oct. 30, 1903 at Logan, son of George and Elsie May Kirk Cleveland. He attended school at Logan and Pisgah, where he was graduated from high school. Following graduation, he engaged in farm work. In 1928, he married Lena Krich. She died in 1930. He continued farming and worked for a friend, Frank Soukup, near Woodbine. On Oct. 7, 1933 he married Viola Sewing. The couple spent most of their life farming for Mr and Mrs Frank Seidler, Sr. of Co. Bluffs, Mrs Helen Rodenburg and children near Underwood, Mr and Mrs Bosie Guill of Underwood, and 25 years for Dale Petersen, east of Harlan in the Jacksonville area. In Nov. of 1974, Dean and Viola moved to Woodbine, where he died at his home Feb. 17, 1975 at age 72. He was a member of Logan, and Broadway United Methodist church of Co. Bluffs and since 1974, the Woodbine United Methodist church.

Preceding him in death were his parents and his first wife. Survivors include his wife, Viola, his brothers - Glen of Omaha, Nebr., and Truman of Tecumseh, Mo., and one niece - Marilyn Cleveland of Omaha and many other relatives.

Funeral services were held at United Methodist church, Woodbine, on Thursday, Febr. 20, 1975 with Rev. Arthur Hill, officiating. Burial was in the Woodbine cemetery. Casket bearers were Dale Petersen, Dwight Mills, Lorin Mills, Donald Ulmer, Gerald Ulmer and Frank Hull.
