

JAMES E. DAHLOF, 82

James Earl Dahlof, son of Helmfred and Cassie Alwill Dahlof, was born June 16, 1891 on a farm in Polk township in Shelby county. He attended country school at Danway and one year of high school in Kirkman. He married Ella Petersen on Aug. 27, 1912 in Harlan. To this union three children were born: Howard of Walnut, Donald of Kirkman and Arlene at home. He lived on the home farm for 57 years before moving to Harlan in 1948, where he lived until his death on April 11, 1974 at Myrtue hospital in Harlan, at age 82 years, 9 months, 25 days. Jim was a member of the Church of Christ of Redline. He accepted Christ in 1909 and served as an elder of the church from 1945 until his death. He had served on the Polk township election board, as a director of the Federal Land Bank, the Farmers Home Administration and served on the Shelby Co. Board of Supervisors.

He was preceded in death by his parents and sister, Isabelle Dahlof. Jim is survived by his wife, Ella, his three children; by six grandchildren and two great grandchildren; his brother - Chester Dahlof of Harlan; his nieces and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at the Pauley Home for Funerals in Harlan on, Monday, April 15, 1974 with Bro. David K. Dvorak of the Redline Church of Christ and Dr. Gary Jorgensen, officiating. Burial was in the Harlan cemetery with Sam Lambert, Dallas Dent, Homer Hanson, Gilbert Hanson, Archie Petersen, J. Earl Anderson and Clifford Kaufman serving as pallbearers.
