Raleigh Favid Erdman, the son of William and Catherine Klinger Erdman, was born in Larned, Kans., on Jan. 9, 1892. He attended school and grew to adulthood in Larned. On May 25, 1913, Raleigh was married to Gussie Thompson at Great Bend, Kans. Three children were born to

this union.

Shortly after their marriage, Mr and Mrs Erdman moved to Liberal, Kans., and this was their home until 1916 when they moved to Cimarron, Kans., where Raleigh was a merchant active in the produce and lumber business. He retired in 1955 but they continued to make their home in Cimarron until 1976 when they moved to Harlan, to be near their daughter. In Aug. of this year, Mr Erdman became a resident of the Baptist Memorial Home Harlan. It was here that he died on Sept. 4, 1979, having attained the age of 87 years, 7 months and 25 days. He had been a member of the First United Methodist church in Harlan.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by two brothers - Charles and William Erdman; and two sisters - Beulah Starr and Ruby Erdman, his twin.
