Gerald Herbert Christian Eyer, son of Sam and Mina Bruhn Eyer, was born on a farm in Soldier twp., Crawford county, on April 30, 1915. He was baptized at the Soldier Immanuel Lutheran church, in Soldier twp., Crawford county and was later confirmed at St. Paul's Lutheran church, Hanover twp.

He attended school at St. Paul's Lutheran and also Immanuel Lutheran school's. He grew to adulthood on the farm and also worked out for other area farmers before

he started farming for himself.

On Aug. 10, 1938, he married Adeline Hingst, at St. John's Lutheran church in Charter Oak. Two children were born to this union. After their marriage he continued to farm until 1980 when he retired. In April of 1980 they moved to Portsmouth and this has been their home since that time.
