

Lavaughn W. Frain, 60

Harlan - Lavaughn Wesley Frain, son of Henry Ray and Myrtle Francis Houser Frain was born March 25, 1920 in Macedonia. He attended school at the Grove twp. country school and grew to adulthood on his parent's farm near Macedonia.

On July 11, 1942, he was inducted into the Army to serve his country during WW II. Before entering active duty, he married Anna Mae Stifle in Maryville, Mo., on July 13, 1942. Six children were born to this union. After receiving his honorable discharge on Oct. 21, 1945, he returned to Macedonia to farm on the family farm. He later moved to Omaha, Neb., where he was employed at the Armour Meat Packing Co. for 12 years. He also worked for the Shelby County Road Dept. for one season before retiring. He died at his home in Harlan, on Monday, Feb. 16, 1981, at age 60 years, 10 months and 21 days.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by one son, Daniel in Oct. of 1973 and one sister, Florence Frain in 1946. Survivors include three sons, Allen of Ft. Collins, Colo.; Alvin (Swede) of Wellington, Colo., and David of Omaha, Neb.; two daughters, Aletha Frain of Eustis, Fla., and Diane (Mrs Charles) White of Jacksonville, Fla.; eight grandchildren and nine step grandchildren; two sisters, Luella Andersen of Henderson, and Gail (Mrs Loren) Bradshaw of Griswold; nieces, nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at the United Methodist church in Macedonia, on

Wednesday, Feb. 18, 1981 with Rev. Edward G. Beck, officiating. Burial was in the Macedonia cemetery with Floyd Rose, Jess Blaine, Jerry Frain, Fay Rose, John Clayton and Kenneth Strong serving as casketbearers. Military rites were conducted at the cemetery by the Ruby Smith Legion Post No. 648 of Macedonia.
