

**Jack W. Ingwers, 46**

Colorado — Jack William Ingwers was born in Harlan, in Shelby county on May 21, 1934, son of William and Mary Ingwers. He grew up in that community attending public schools and participating in high school athletics, especially football. On May 30, 1954 he was baptized and confirmed in the Bethlehem Lutheran church in Jacksonville. That same year he married Norma Petersen on July 11, 1954. Four children were born to this union. He worked as an electrician.

After two years they moved to Denver, Colo., where they lived on South Corona before moving to Lawell Blvd. and finally to Eaton Way. He took up his electrician trade here as a part of the Electricians Local No. 68.

In 1967 he entered the sales field eventually setting up his own business as a manufacturer's representative for indoor-outdoor lighting. At the time of his death he was partner in Intermountain Lighting Sales Co. He volunteered his time with Indian Guides, Cub Scouts and Boy Scouts especially participating in outings and activities with the boys. He was active in his church, Christ the King Lutheran, where he served on the Church Council, was a Luther League youth sponsor. Camping with the family was always a favorite activity, snow and water skiing, were usually family events. He died following a brief illness on Monday, Dec. 15, 1980 at age 46 years, seven months.

Survivors include his wife Norma, and four children: Thomas, of Santa Maria, Calif., Richard, Bruce and Elizabeth at home; his parents, William and Mary Ingwers of Harlan, and two sisters, Geraldine Scanlon of San Bernardino, Calif., and Janice Taylor of Palm Springs, Calif.; nieces and nephews.
