

Roy H. Jahn, 57

Manilla - Roy H. Jahn, son of Hugo H. and Hattie Mordhorst Jahn, was born April 15, 1923 in Hayes twp, Crawford county. He received his education in Hayes twp. He was confirmed in the Lutheran faith. He married Arlene Bando on April 21, 1946. This union was blessed with three children.

He farmed in Hayes twp until Dec. 1965, when he sold his farming operation and moved to Manilla. While living on the farm Roy raised purebred Hampshire Swine and had a Brown Swiss dairy herd. The Jahn family has raised purebred Hampshire Swine for 60 consecutive years. After moving to Manilla he worked as a meat cutter at Stenzel's Food Store, and in June of 1966 he began working for the Farm Service Coop.

He was active in community and church affairs. He served on the Board of Directors of the Aspinwall Coop, and was a member of the Manilla Community club. He was a member of the Trinity Lutheran church, Manilla, serving as an Elder, member and officer of the LLL, head usher, choir member, member and president of the Couples club, and as Sunday school superintendent. He died Thursday, Aug. 28, 1980 in Manilla at age 57 years, 4 months and 13 days.

He was preceded in death by his parents, and an infant sister. Surviving include his wife, Arlene, and three children: Gail, (Mrs. Don) Amenson of Phoenix, Ariz; Gary of Harlan, and Gregory of Spencer, by four grandchildren, and brothers and sister, Lois (Mrs. Clifford) Joens of Manilla, Arlo and Wilbur Jahn of Denison, by an aunt, Adele Mordhorst of Cheyenne, Wyo., nieces, nephews, and other relatives.
