

## Norman E. Jorgensen, 82

Norman Everett Jorgensen, the son of James Christian and Martha E. Johnson Jorgensen, was born in Harlan on April 29, 1900. He attended school in both Harlan and Irwin. After school he helped on the family farm while growing to adulthood.

On July 20, 1942, he enlisted in the U.S. Naval Reserve. He served his country during WW II as a Aviation Machist's Mate Second Class, helping with general maintenance and overhaul of aircraft. He received his Honorable Discharge on Feb. 21, 1945.

After his parents died, he and his two brothers Clarence and Dale, took over the family farm. Between the three of them, they farmed this farm until 1948, when they all moved to Omaha and worked as Cattle Feeders and Livestock Speculators. He retired in 1968, and after doing so, made his home between Omaha, Neb. and Anaheim, Calif., and was currently living in Anaheim. He died at Martin Luther hospital Medical Center on Monday, Feb. 28, 1983 having attained the age of 82 years, 9 months and 30 days.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by four brothers, Leonard, Dewey, Dale and Paul; also one sister, Marie. He is survived by his two brothers, Elliott of Harlan and Clarence of Omaha, Neb.; one sister, Helen Gloeckl of Belton, Mo.; nieces, nephews and other relatives.

Gravesides services were held at the Harlan cemetery in Harlan, March 5, 1983 with Pastor Kenneth Alpers of Immanuel Lutheran church in Harlan, officiating.
