

## Tom Kelley, 86

Thomas William Kelley, son of William and Etta Weatherill Kelley, was born Sept. 6, 1896 in rural Harrison co. He was the oldest son in a family of seven children. At an early age he and his family moved to Washington twp. in Shelby co., where he grew to manhood. He served with the U.S. Army during World War I. He was a member of the American Legion Weiss Post No. 143.

On Nov. 30, 1921 he married Luella Park. To this union seven children were born. They farmed by Panama, until 1942 when they bought a farm in Harrison county where they lived until they retired to their present home in Woodbine in 1963. He maintained his active interest in farming throughout his life.

He was preceded in death by his parents and two brothers, George and Charlie. He is survived by his wife Luella; sons, Walter of Woodbine, Earl of Panama, Alvin of Mundelein, Ill., Donald of Woodbine and George of Co. Bluffs; daughters: Opal Toxword of Omaha, Neb. and Lois (Mrs Robert) Schraeder of Woodbine. Burial was in the Woodbine cemetery with Fouts Funeral Home in charge.
