

THE LIFE STORY OF —

Richard Kemp, 80

R.G. (Dick) Kemp son of Laurence and Susie Swinehart Kemp was born Dec. 8, 1902, southeast of Harlan in Center twp. and attended the Windy Knoel school.

He married Audrey Arlene Errett on June 20, 1927 in Harlan and they farmed southeast of Harlan until 1936 when they moved to a farm two miles east of Walnut. In 1941 they moved to a farm 4 miles northwest of Atlantic and retired into Atlantic in 1975 to their present home. He was a member of the First United Methodist church. He died Saturday, Dec. 11, 1982 at the age of 80 years.

He was preceded in death by his parents, two brothers, James and Paul, and a sister, Bernice Christensen. Survivors include his wife, Audrey; a daughter, Mrs Gilbert (Jean) Lacey of Colesburg; three grandchildren, John Lacey of Altus Okla., Sherry Lace of Great Falls, Mont., and Mrs Michael (Shelly) Schauwecker of Omaha; two great grandchildren; three sisters, Mrs Ellis (Blanche) Gearhart and Mrs Andrew (Esther) Christensen, both of Harlan and Mrs Kie (Ina) Petersen of Kimballton.
