

Daryl D. Kohlscheen, 52

WALNUT — Daryl D. Kohlscheen, son of Carl and Carolyn Denker Kohlscheen, was born Jan. 7, 1926 in Tulare, S.D. The family moved to the Walnut area, where they farmed. He served his country during WWII. He was a member of the Walnut American Legion and Amvets. He was also a member of the Peace United Church of Christ. He died Friday, Nov. 24, 1978 at Veterans Hospital in Omaha, at age 52 years, 10 months and 17 days.

He was preceded in death by his father. Survivors include a son - Kevin of Des Moines, a daughter - Kendal of Carroll; his mother - Mrs Carolyn Kohlscheen of Walnut; two brothers - Walter of San Diego, Calif. and Leland of Tucson, Ariz.; two sisters, Emma (Mrs Joseph) Hamilton and Wilma (Mrs Harold) Morris of Omaha.

Funeral services were held Monday, Nov. 27, 1978 at the Peace United Church of Christ in Walnut, with Rev. Bruno Romanowski, officiating.
