

THE LIFE STORY OF —

Albert F. Kramer, 68

Albert Francis Kramer, son of Joseph and Eleanor Assman Kramer, was born Sept. 11, 1915 near Earling. He attended school in Earling and worked as a farm hand. He later went to Northern Iowa to work in the harvest fields.

On Feb. 18, 1941 he married Dolores Youngswirth at Whittemore. After their marriage, they lived in Ayrshire, where he was a Watkins dealer. Later, they started farming in the Kossuth co. area. In 1978 they moved to Algona, where he was semi-retired and was a member of the Knights of Columbus. He died at the Kossuth co. hospital in Algona, on Thursday, July 12, 1984 of heart failure at the age of 68.

He is survived by his wife Dolores and one daughter Karen, Mrs Kayvan Minaei of Tampa, Fla., and also five brothers and two sisters: Joe, Marie, Mrs Clarence Freund and Alfons (Mike) all of Earling, Margaret, Mrs Otto Klein of Panama, Leonard and Leo of Omaha, Neb., and Robert of Harlan.

Funeral services for Mr Kramer were held Monday, July 16, 1984 in St. Cecelia's Catholic church in Algona with Rev. Thomas Nash as celebrant and Rev. Gerald Stessman and Rev. Eugene Klein as concelebrants.

Burial was in Calvary cemetery in Algona. Casketbearers were Clarence Ardorfer, Gordon Davidson, Robert Eischen, Robert Mayer, Elmer Anliker and Dennis Lickteig.
