Casper A. Langenfeld, 99

Earling — Dr Casper A. Langenfeld, was born Febr. 23, 1885 in Shelby county, son of Nick and Catherine Langenfeld. He married Anna Y. Persche in Westphalia, Sept. 4, 1907. They farmed near Earling until he entered veterinary college. He went to Chicago Veterinary college in 1911 and after graduation he began practice in Carroll, where he practiced 46 years. His wife Anna died Mar. 26, 1926. Dr. Langenfeld was a member of Holy Spirit church, the Charles Carroll Council Knights of Columbus and the Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus Assembly. On July 21, 1927 he married Margaret Nagl.

He was preceded in death by his wife Margaret on June 25, 1968; a son and daughter; two brothers - John and William and a sister Clara. Survivors include five children - Felix and Omer of Carroll, Sister, Lourdes, (Lorene) of St. Louis, Mo., Vincent of Omaha, Nebr.; Mrs Frank (Helen Margaret) of Clear Lake; three stepchildren, Mrs L. B. (Florence) Westendorf, Albert Nagl and Lousi Nagl of Carroll; 29 grandchildren, 30 great grandchildren, four sisters - Wilhelmina Heese of Earling, Sr. M. Clarita of Chicago, Dora Gambee of Portland, Oreg.
