

## Lotus M. Larsen, 62

Kimballton — Lotus Mae Larsen, daughter of Hayes A. and Mary Jensen Frampton, was born on a farm near Cuppy's Grove in Shelby county, on Nov. 16, 1917. She was baptized in the Danish Baptist church in Harlan. She attended country school and grew to adulthood on her parent's farm.

On Dec. 5, 1937, she married Elmer Larsen at her parent's home north of Harlan. Two daughters were born to this union. They farmed south of Harlan until 1973 when they retired and moved to Kimballton. This has been their home since that time. Mrs Larsen died at the Myrtue Memorial hospital in Harlan, on Saturday, Feb. 2, 1980, at age of 62 years, two months and 16 days. She had been a member of the Bethel Baptist church in Harlan.
